Materials Needed

- Tables with paper covering
- Outlets for low temp glue guns
- Outside space for washing the debris in plastic tubs
- Access to a hose to fill the tubs.

Additional Information

- A meeting with the classroom educator is required prior to the start of this experience.
- Another option is making debris crowns from already washed materials, this would just need the tables with paper covering and enough outlets for the low temp glue guns.

Program Experience

ARTCYLCLE WITH MARINE DEBRIS

In the hands of an artist, debris washed up onto a beach can become a beautiful, evocative reminder of the role humans play in the stewardship of our natural resources.

During this program, students will sort and clean marine debris while discussing the environmental impact of waste items. Together, they will learn about sculptures and generate ideas around creating a three-dimensional collaborative piece using wire and/or glue.
