About Sarah

Sarah enjoys working with young people and creating with materials that are recyclable or usually thrown away. Thinking up different ways to create a three-dimensional piece that can be worn, hung on the wall, or placed as sculpture is a lot of fun! Using recycled and waste items as media raises consciousness about the items we use and throw away.

Program Experience

In the hands of an artist, debris washed up onto a beach can become a beautiful, evocative reminder of the role humans play in the stewardship of our natural resources.

During this program, students will sort and clean marine debris while discussing the environmental impact of waste items.

Together, they will learn about sculptures and generate ideas around creating a three-dimensional collaborative piece using wire and/or glue.

Curriculum Connections

Earth Science: Explore human impacts on earth systems, and how consumption and population dynamics impact marine debris, watersheds, and ocean currents.

Physical Science: Characterizing the structure and function of materials and how they are impacted by the marine environment.
